Our value: Generosity

This half-term, we will be exploring the importance and simplicity of generosity with the children.

Through stories, discussions and practical activities, we will be encouraging them to think about how they can do good, show kindness and share with others.



This terms topic: This is me!

What better starting point for learning than the children themselves! In science we will study animals including humans, identifying and naming body parts as well as exploring our five senses. Closely



linked is our history topic where the children will use historical enquiry to learn about significant people who have made a difference to the medical world, including Louis Braille, Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale. We have chosen four super picture books to ignite our writing of factual descriptions, fairy stories and character settings! In EYFS we will be starting by thinking about our faces. We will think about our senses and how our faces can show others how we feel and how a smile can make others feel! Please see our school website for more curriculum information.



Belonging

In PSHE and RE we will be focussing on what it means to belong and how we help each other belong. We will explore ourselves, what makes us the same and what makes us unique, families, school life, clubs and activities as well as how people belong to religious groups.
